Arlington E-CARE Spring Recycling

Arlington County's spring Environmental Collection and Recycling Event (E-CARE) is set for Saturday, April 7 from 8:30am to 3:00pm—rain or shine.

Join the recycling efforts in the west parking lot at Thomas Jefferson Middle School at 125 S. Old Glebe Road. Bring your ID to verify residency.

Dispose of old or expired household hazardous materials (HHM) such as small metal items, electronics, TV's and computer monitors. There is a \$15 fee for each computer monitor and a \$20 fee for each TV containing cathode ray tubes. These fees are payable by cash or check only.

Acceptable small metal items include pots, pans, tools, pipes, Venetian blinds, small appliances, and metal items fitting in an 11.5 inch by 46 inch opening.

Bikes For The World will accept serviceable and repairable bicycles to be sent to countries where they are needed for basic transportation. A \$10 donation per bike is requested to help with shipping costs.

Art For Humanity will collect gently-used shoes, clothing, linens, baby strollers, microwaves, air conditioners, rugs, mattresses and bed frames. All styles and seasons of clothing are appreciated, with child and youth sizes especially needed

In addition you can donate eyeglasses and durable medical equipment like hearing aids, wheelchairs, walkers, canes, crutches, and strollers. They will be cleaned and sent to clinics overseas run by volunteers.

Spring is here, and it's time to think about using our beautiful basketball and tennis courts. Plus, we're already thinking about summer fun at the Fairlington Glen pool. See the May calendar for the pool opening dates. As in the past, you don't need not reapply for a recreation pass UNLESS you have lost a pass (and there is a \$5 charge for replacement passes) or if a family member has turned 12 in the last year. You can choose to get a family pass which can be used by all family members or have passes issued in individual names (for those over the age of 12).

Or, print this page, fill out the information below, and mail it to Sandy at 4138 S. 36th Street. Do this by May 11 to ensure that your pass will be available by the time the pool opens. We will accept applications after the deadline date but processing of late applications may take up to 2 weeks.

Passes will be hand-delivered in a plain white envelope. The code for the tennis court is on the bottom right of the pass. These laminated passes are good for as long as you live in the Glen. If you are an owner and choose to move out and rent your home, you can still come to the pool. We'll provide your renter a pass if requested, but that does not affect your ability to come to the pool.


EARTH DAY

FIRE SAFETY TIPS

It may not be Fire Prevention Month yet, but this is as good a time as any to share some valuable fire safety information. Did you know? Cooking is the number one cause of home fires and injuries in the U.S. And smoking is the leading cause of fire deaths. Each year nearly 2600 people die in U.S. home fires.

- 1. Install and maintain smoke detectors on each level of your home and outside of each bedroom. Be sure to replace the batteries in your smoke detectors twice a year. It's suggested that you do this when you change clocks for daylight saving time or when the detector chirps to signal the battery is dying. Also, remember to test smoke detectors once a month.
- 2. Make sure you family has a plan in case of a fire. Plan two ways to get out of every room. Choose a meeting place outside where everyone should gather. Once you are out, stay out! It's a great idea to practice your family's escape route.



Recycling Fun Facts



- Recycling one aluminum can saves enough energy to run a TV for three hours.
- Once an aluminum can is recycled, it can be part of a new can within six weeks.
- More aluminum goes into beverage cans than any other product.
- During the time it takes you to read this sentence, 50,000 12-ounce cans are made.
- An aluminum can that is thrown away will still be a can 500 years from now.
- If all of our newspaper was recycled, we could save about 250,000,000 trees each year.
- The amount of wood and paper we throw away each year is enough to heat 50,000,000 homes for 20 years.
- Each ton of recycled paper can save 17 trees, 380 gallons of oil, 3 cubic yards of landfill space, and 7,000 gallons of water.
- Only 27% of the newspapers produced in the U.S. are recycled.
- Americans use 2,500,000 plastic bottles every hour. Most of them are thrown away.
- Plastic bags and other plastic garbage thrown into the ocean kill as many as 1,000,000 sea creatures every year.
- Recycling plastic saves twice as much energy as burning it in an incinerator.
- Every month, we throw out enough glass bottles and jars to fill up a giant skyscraper. ALL of these jars are recyclable!
- The energy saved from recycling one glass bottle can run a 100-watt light bulb for four hours or a compact fluorescent bulb for 20 hours.
- A modern glass bottle takes 4,000 years or more to decompose—and even longer
 if it's in a landfill.
