## Testing Continues As December Starts

ECS Mid-Atlantic, LLC (ECS) has begun its next round of testing in the Glen as part of an ongoing environmental investigation of an offsite property. This work involves collecting groundwater samples in 14 different spots in the common area spaces located around Courts 1 & 13 and Court 14 on S. Stafford Street.

An informational meeting open to all Glen co-owners and residents was held on November 10 at the Fairlington Community Center to discuss the impact of the dry cleaning chemicals found in the groundwater around Courts 1 & 2. The following representatives conducted the meeting:

In addition, Lyn Hainge, Josephine Peters, and Colleen Ryan-Smith attended on behalf of the Arlington County Health Department.

ECS, the company hired by the shopping center in which the dry cleaner is located to drill and test the groundwater and emitted gases, explained the history of the solvent in the groundwater from the old dry cleaner on Fern Street in Alexandria. The ECS representatives also discussed the next steps, which included the additional outside drilling that's now underway AND the testing of sub-slab air samples inside certain houses in Courts 1 & 2, which has already been done.

Audio from the November 10 meeting was recorded, and soon a link to the recording will be made available on our website.

### Glen Elects New Board For 2017

At the Glen's Annual Meeting on November 2, 2016, a quorum was reached and the election results were announced.

Thora Stanwood was elected to the Board of Directors for a term of three years by a vote of 43% of the voting interest (97% of the votes cast).

In addition, the 2017 budget was approved by a vote of 41% of the voting interest (93% of the votes cast) and the minutes of the 2015 Annual Meeting were approved by a vote of 44% of the voting interest (99% of the votes cast).

Payment is due on or before the first day of each month, and a \$25 late fee will be assessed for payments received after the 10th of the month.

## HOW TO PAY YOUR MONTHLY FEE

This month, Cardinal Management Group will be sending out the 2017 payment coupon books to co-owners who are not signed up for direct debit of their accounts. If you do not receive your coupon booklet by 12/20/16, please contact Cardinal at 703-569-5797. Co-owners who choose this method simply mail their coupon and check to Cardinal each month. The address to mail your payments will be changing, so please be sure to look for the new address on your coupon book once it arrives this month.



Co-owners can also choose to authorize Cardinal to directly debit their bank accounts for the payment of monthly fees by filling out the form on page 4 of this newsletter and mailing it to Cardinal at the address noted on the form with a voided check. This free automatic debit seems to be the easiest method for most in the Glen. As noted on the form, the direct debit authorization will remain in effect, and will be adjusted automatically by Cardinal each year to reflect changed fee levels, until you provide written notification of its termination.

**IMPORTANT:** Some co-owners may have automatic bill arrangements with their banks (without directly debiting their account by Cardinal). In this case, you should update these arrangements to reflect the new fee levels.

Cardinal also allows you to pay each month online through their website, although there are service charges involved with each transaction. ## Verizon FiOS Phase I Is Underway



Many Glen co-owners and residents are looking forward to having Verizon FiOS as a choice when it comes to TV, internet, and home phone service. And the good news is that work toward that goal is underway.

On November 28, contractors for Verizon began Phase I, which is the installation of a gray PVC conduit inside our patios from the back fence to the building. The fiber optic cable will be housed inside the conduit, which will be clamped to the lower edge of the patio fence. At a future date, when the fiber optic cable has been threaded through the PVC pipe, you may un-

clamp the PVC pipe from the fence and bury it with mulch or dirt OR you may choose to leave it as installed.

In our 23 B Buildings in the Glen, an additional brick-colored conduit will be installed vertically from ground level up the back of the building to reach the upper unit. There will be two such conduits on each B Building for the two upper level units.

Phase II is the placement of ground-level junction boxes which may connect up to eight units. A separate Verizon contractor will soon begin this work.

Phase III is the connection of all the junction boxes to Verizon's main junction box, which will physically connect all units to the Verizon optical system. Once the lines outside the units are fully connected, the lines will be tested, a database will be built, and network connection will be created. A unit owner, if he/she so chooses, can then go to Verizon's website to see if his/her unit is FiOS ready, and can then set up an appointment with a Verizon contractor to connect the outside line to the inside of the unit.

## Congratulations To Court 5

At Fairlington Glen's Annual Meeting on Wednesday, November 2, Court 5 was awarded the annual Most Improved Water Usage Award. Court 5's water usage in the four quarters ending August 2016 decreased 18.7% over the three previous years' average. The Board of Directors applauds this example of good citizenship within our community.



There are many easy steps to reduce water usage, and here are a few:

- 1. When buying new washing machines, dishwashers, or toilets buy those with ENERGY STAR ratings that use less water and save energy.
- 2. Run your dishwasher & washing machine only when filled to capacity.
- 3. Check your pipes and faucets for small leaks.
- 4. Turn off the tap while you shave or brush your teeth.

We appreciate anything you can do to help keep our water usage costs down.

## Masonry Stoop Restoration Project Begins

During the summer, Board Secretary and Maintenance Chair Bill Worsley surveyed all 181 front stoops in the Glen and identified the worst ones for structural and foundation repairs. On September 13, the Board approved a contract with C.A. Lindman, Inc. in the amount of \$274,830 (a reserve expenditure) to repair the worst stoops at 26 addresses and complete brick façade repairs at 21 buildings. This fall, the work has begun in Court 9.

Due to weather and Arlington County permit delays, only Court 9 will be completed this month. Those stoops in Court 10, originally scheduled to be repaired before the holidays, will be post-



poned until the spring when the remainder of the project will continue.

A complete list of the 26 stoops that will be renovated is provided below.

It is worth noting that our contractor has advised during the winter months to use SAND ONLY on our brick stoops to melt snow and ice. Please do not use salt or ice melt as these products contribute to the erosion of the stoops. Our onsite staff has been advised of this change. We also ask any residents who have been spreading salt or ice melt on their own brick stoops to discontinue that practice and instead switch to sand.

## Winter is Coming, And The Glen Is Prepared



Winter doesn't officially begin until December 21, but preparations for wintry weather began in the late summer/early fall here in the Glen.

Our onsite staff has already received a shipment of ice melt and sand, which is stored in the maintenance shop along with the leftover bags from last winter. Ice melt products are used on sidewalks and walkways to residences. Sand alone will be used on our brick stoops from now on to prevent erosion to the structures. The snow blade will be attached to the tractor to help clear side-

walks as soon as the forecast calls for wintry weather. And our snow blower is ready for action.

In October the Board unanimously approved a proposal from NVM Contractors for snow plowing/sanding services on an as-needed basis for our courtyard parking lots. NVM was our contractor last year, and they did terrific work clearing the Glen during the blizzard.


The association provides limited snow removal from parking areas and sidewalks. Contractors and onsite staff begin work as soon as is reasonably possible after significant snow accumulations. Keep in mind, though, the contractors and on-site staff don't live in the Glen. It has to be safe for them to travel here from their homes.

The Board encourages residents to contribute to snow removal in the areas around their units and parking lots.
